Much has already been thought and written about abstract art, about abstraction. In research, however, the reception has been changing for some years: Hilma af Klimt, since the rediscovery after decades of long self-banishment of her works after her death, suddenly helps art history to think in a new way...

The exhibition abstract is neither a curatorial assertion, nor an epoch-making show. Rather, it is a pleasurable summary of the program that defines Semjon Contemporary gallery, where the fields of representational art and photography are also part of the gallery's self-definition.

abstract meanders between the marginal areas, at least the influences of Concrete Art (Colin Ardley, Dittmar Danner aka Krüger, Klaus Steinmann, the field of Minimalism and Conceptual Art (Ute Essig, Michael Kutschbach, Stefan Ludes, Dirk Rathke, Thomas Prochnow, Ursula Sax, Gerda Schütte, Gil Shachar, Li Silberberg, Hitomi Uchikura, Marc von der Hocht, Amélie von Heydebreck, Bettina Weiß), to lyrical abstraction (Takayuki Daikoku Renate Hampke, Nataly Hocke and Nicole Wendel). Transitory moments between the artistic fields are self-evident.

Represented are paintings, sculptures/objects, wall objects, photograms and works on and with paper.
